INTERNATIONALIZATION, MODERNIZATION AND INNOVATIONS ARE PRIORITIES OF THE STRATEGY OF THE PAN-EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY PRAGUE

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The Pan-European University Prague introduced and fully applies the ECTS credit system, which is one of the tools ensuring the transparency of the recognition process. Pan-European University also introduced the issuance of a diploma supplement for the bachelor's and master's cycle of education.

International mobility, helping individuals to increase their professional, social and intercultural skills and thus contributing to their employability, forms the cornerstone of the internationalization and modernization of higher education and is the main tool for the further development of the European area of higher education. International cooperation helps to raise the level of educational attainment of graduates and researchers that Europe needs.

Pan-European University has expanded and strengthened existing international contacts, both within the EU and outside the EU. Pan-European University was twice awarded the prestigious Diploma Supplement Label award. Such an active partnership is the key to successful mobilities, the quality of higher education programs and a source of experience for students and staff, which is why the Erasmus partnership activities are continuously monitored and regularly evaluated. Inter-institutional agreements are based on a comprehensive understanding of the partner institution, the compatibility of academic profiles and a relationship of trust between the contracting institutions. The conclusion of bilateral agreements respects academic interests and the preservation of geographical and disciplinary balance.

Ambitions of the university is to contribute and improve the quality and relevance of higher education as declared in all strategic documents.

Mobility and cross-border cooperation, especially within the lifelong learning program, which is the basis of the modernization and internationalization of the institution, will continue to be developed through existing and new partnerships within the EU and outside the EU. The priority of internationalization and modernization within the lifelong learning program will be student mobility, student internships will be more significantly supported and promoted, as higher education institutions, research and businesses are connected through them, which leads to the achievement of excellence and regional development. Student internships are a mandatory part of the study program, a mandatory study obligation of the first and second cycle of study.

By supporting student mobility for the purpose of study, it is possible to increase the level of educational attainment of graduates and researchers that Europe needs. University of Entrepreneurship and Law offers mentoring and support activities to incoming and outgoing students. University of Entrepreneurship and Law makes great efforts to ensure the integration of mobile students. Local students voluntarily engage in accompanying activities ensuring the interaction of incoming students with locals.

Pan-European University employees mobility will be supported. Staff mobility will be recognized as part of the regular workload. All mobility activities will be recognized by an internal employee evaluation system.
